I. Expanding Supports for Crime Victims Amendment Act of 2022

- Crime victim's compensation compensates victims of crime through the dc superior court list of crimes has been expanded, financial exploitation, destruction of property (partner or discharge of firearm), veterinary expenses for animals injured
- Promote cooperation with law enforcement, report crimes to law enforcement; promotes reporting requirements; allows for more reliable evidence to help establish victim of crime status
- Seek compensation within a year from the incident
- Discovery exception "statutory rape example" where it's not identified until years after in therapy or until someone else points out that what happened was a crime
- Within 1 year after learning of the program and can be proven then past traumatizing experiences can be filed
- Will bill cover intimate partner violence; yes, need to apply within the 1-year time limit; temporary or civil protection order will suffice as well as forensic medical exams
- Will should become effective late April; must go through congress
- CVC is not funded by local dollars at all, funded by fines and fees given in court
- Every year half of the balance is swept and added into the crime-making assistance fund
- Documentation: victims can apply and retain confidentiality
- Authorized figure must validate the crime
- No age restriction, child can be covered under parents' claim as secondary party
- MPD is to notify all victims and OVSJG grantees are required to tell their clients
- 3 victim support roles are to be merged under the new bill to increase capacity and efficiency

II. Coalition Updates

- Environmental Scan interviews are complete; next step will be a separate meeting completely devoted to discussing results and next steps; seeking an outside facilitator
- City has launched its search for a new Director of OVSJG
- FY24 Budget Planning
 - Will provide survey to further assess needs
 - Identify budget priorities
 - DCCESV will provide talking points
- Working to better understand the housing needs of sexual assault survivors and where this is similarity and difference to domestic violence
- Will be developing a survivor council
- Hoping to make next meeting in-person
